Fair point, for certainly the church should be concerned to follow truth, not just the latest 'trend'.

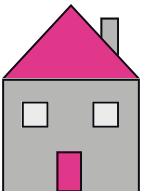
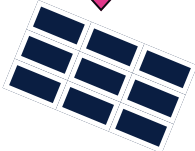
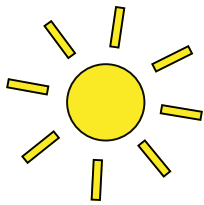
But wait a minute. What if responsibility for the earth isn't just a recent concern but in fact goes back as long as humans have been around?

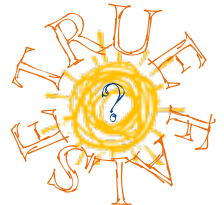

BRUNSWICK REFURB PROJECT

Believe it or not, Brunswick church building is over 40 years old! That is forty years of an open door to everyone and anyone in the Brunswick community through youth work, community work, senior citizen work and of course Sunday services. Some of you may be old enough to remember initiatives such as 'Friends of the Flats' or the 'Drop-In'. Nowadays we have our Open Access project, led by the brilliant Mo, which includes a whole range of services and activities such as Work Club, ESOL and Young@Heart.

That forty-plus years of people coming through the doors, walking over the floors, sitting on seats etc, has meant a lot of wear and tear Do we mind? Not in the slightest! It's what the building is here for, and various consultations and surveys have shown how much it is valued by this community.

However, the building could now do with a bit of refreshing and repair so, with the estate currently going through a programme of renewal and rebuilding by S4B, we thought this is the perfect time for what is in many ways the estate's community



hub to also have a bit of TLC. A refurbishment in fact. So we have launched a project called... Refurb.

A Refurb group, which includes church members and representatives from S4B has already started meeting and, after doing our own survey to find

out what local people wanted from this building, a number of ideas are in early stages of development. The solar panels project is the first of these. More will follow, but for these we will need to raise funds as no provision for community buildings has been made in the funding S4B have been given to work with. The members of the church are willing to do their bit (on top of the hours they give as volunteers running various activities), but we will need help and partners. Not just money, but ideas, expertise and encouragement. Wouldn't it be great if as a community we could make this 'Refurb' happen?
